When to Custom-Build Software

AN HONEST STARTING POINT

We build custom software for a living — so take it as a signal that even we'll tell you when you shouldn't. The wrong build costs you months and real money. The wrong off-the-shelf tool quietly caps your business a year from now. This guide is how to tell which one you're facing.



OPTION A

When Buying Off-the-Shelf Makes Sense

- The problem is common and already solved well — accounting, email, basic scheduling, payments.
- You need to be live in days, not months, to validate whether the idea even works.
- Budget is tight and the tool's limitations won't meaningfully block your next 12 months of growth.
- No part of this process is what actually differentiates your business from competitors.



OPTION B

When Custom-Building Makes Sense

- This process is your actual competitive edge — the thing customers choose you for.
- Off-the-shelf tools force an awkward workaround, or you're stitching together three of them to fake one workflow.
- You're paying per-seat or per-usage fees that will scale worse than a one-time build as you grow.
- You need to own the data, the logic, or the IP outright — not rent access to someone else's platform.



SIDE BY SIDE

The Real Trade-Offs

	Off-the-Shelf	Custom-Built
Speed to launch	Days to weeks	Weeks to months
Upfront cost	Low	Higher
Cost as you scale	Grows with usage/seats	Fixed, one-time
Fits your exact process	Rarely, without workarounds	Built around it

Ownership	You rent access	You own it outright
Ceiling on growth	Hits limits eventually	Scales with the business



THE CHECK

5 Questions to Ask Yourself

- ☐ Is this process the reason customers choose us, or just something we have to do?
- ☐ Will an off-the-shelf tool still fit in 12 months, or will we outgrow it fast?
- ☐ Are we paying more in recurring fees than a one-time build would cost over 2-3 years?
- ☐ Do we need to own this data and logic outright, for control, compliance, or resale value?
- ☐ Is speed-to-launch more valuable right now than getting it exactly right?

Three or more checked? You're likely looking at a custom build — and it's worth scoping properly before committing budget either way.
